

## Grand County pioneer dies

Funeral services were held for G. Russell Wood, 77, Dec. 8 at 2 p.m., at Kremmling Community Church. He was a member of the Grand County Pioneer Association.

Mr. Wood died Dec. 5 at the Routt Memorial Extended Care Center, Steamboat Springs, Colo.

He was born in Dunlap, Kan., Aug. 26, 1906, and reared in the Parshall, Williams Fork area. He owned and operated the Red and White Store, Parshall, for 20 years and was employed at Brown and Jones and Kremmling Timber, Kremmling, before his retirement. He was liked and respected by all.

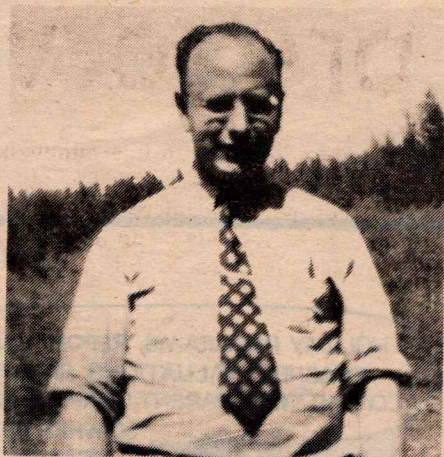
